This symbol is to alert you to important operating or servicing instructions that may appear in this user's manual. Always follow basic safety precautions when using this product to reduce the risk of injury, fire, or electric shock.

Safety information

- Read and understand all instructions in the user's manual. Observe all markings on the product.
- Avoid using a telephone during a thunderstorm. There may be a slight chance of electric shock from lightning.
- Do not use a telephone in the vicinity of a gas leak. If you suspect a gas leak, report
 it immediately, but use a telephone away from the area where gas is leaking. If this
 product is a cordless model, make sure the base is also away from the area.
- Do not use this product near water or when you are wet. For example, do not use it in a wet basement or shower, nor next to a swimming pool, bathtub, kitchen sink and laundry tub. Do not use liquids or aerosol sprays for cleaning. If the product comes in contact with any liquid, unplug any line or power cord immediately. Do not plug the product back in until it has dried thoroughly.
- Install this product in a protected location where no one can trip over any line or power cords. Protect cords from damage or abrasion.
- If this product does not operate normally, see the **Troubleshooting** section of this user's manual. If you cannot solve the problem, or if the product is damaged, refer to the **Limited warranty** section (pages 21 23). Do not open this product except as directed in your user's manual. Opening the product or reassembling it incorrectly may expose you to hazardous voltages or other risks.
- If this product has user-replaceable batteries, replace batteries only as described in your user's manual. Do not burn or puncture batteries — they contain caustic chemicals.
- If this product has a three-prong (grounding) plug or a polarized plug with one wide prong, it may not fit in non-polarized outlets. Do not defeat the purpose of these plugs. If they do not fit in your outlet, the outlet should be replaced by an electrician.

Important safety information

Especially about corded telephones

- Electrical power: The telephone base of this corded telephone must be connected to a working electrical outlet which is not controlled by a wall switch. Calls cannot be made from the handset if the telephone base is unplugged, switched off or if the electrical power is interrupted.
- Power adapter: The power adapter is intended to be correctly oriented in a vertical or floor mount position. The prongs are not designed to hold the plug in place if it is plugged into a ceiling, under-the-table or cabinet outlet.

Especially about telephone answering systems

Two-way recording: This unit does not sound warning beeps to inform the other party that the call is being recorded. To ensure that you are in compliance with any federal or state regulations regarding recording a telephone call, you should start the recording process and then inform the other party that you are recording the conversation.

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


Table/desk installation

This telephone includes a 7-foot line cord with a modular plug on each end. Use this cord to connect the telephone to a modular wall jack.


1. Fill in directory card

Remove the directory card and write in your own telephone number. Also write the telephone numbers (or names) that you want to store in each memory location (See Page 13). Reinstall the card and clear plastic cover.



2. Connect handset to base

Plug one end of the coiled handset cord into the handset, and the other end into the base.




3. Connect line cord to telephone

Plug the long line cord into the jack on the underside of the telephone base. Then, feed the line cord through the channel provided so the telephone sits flat on your table or desk during use.

4. Connect line cord to wall jack

Plug free end of the line cord into a modular wall jack. Make sure it snaps firmly into place.





5. Set dial mode switch

This product comes set in tone dialing (TT) mode. Make sure you choose the correct dialing method (TT or DP); touch tone dialing will not work if you have dial pulse service.



6. Check for dial tone

Lift the handset and listen for dial tone. When there is an incoming call, the visual ringer indicator light on the handset flashes.

If you cannot hear a dial tone, refer to the **Troubleshooting** section (Page 15) and try to correct the problem.

To disconnect the telephone, squeeze the clip on the modular plug and pull it out of the jack.






Wall-mount installation (optional)

Wall-mount installation

1. Fill in directory card

Remove the directory card and write in your own telephone number. Also write the telephone numbers (or names) that you want to store in each memory location (See Page 13). Reinstall the card and clear plastic cover




2. Reverse handset tab

To install the telephone on a wall jack, you must reverse the small tab above the directory card. This tab holds the handset in place when you hang up.

With the directory card and plastic cover removed, lift and remove the handset tab.

Reverse the tab and reinstall it, as shown below. Then, replace the directory card and cover.














Plug the line cord into the jack on the underside of the base

Feed the line cord into the channel and wind it around the mounting area. Feed the last portion (as short as possible), through one of the slots in the mounting area.






Wall-mount installation (optional)

4. Install telephone base on wall jack


Hold the base up next to the wall jack, and plug in the line cord. Then, push the base against the wall jack and down until it is held securely by the mounting studs.

NOTE: If you cannot fit the base onto the wall jack, remove the four non-slip pads.



5. Connect handset to base

Plug one end of the coiled handset cord into the handset, and the other end into the base. Then, hang up.



6. Set dial mode switch

This product comes set in tone dialing (TT) mode. Make sure you choose the correct dialing method (TT or DP); touch tone dialing will not work if you have dial pulse service




7. Check for dial tone


Lift the handset and listen for dial tone. When there is an incoming call, the visual ringer indicator light on the handset flashes.

If you cannot hear a dial tone, refer to the **Troubleshooting** section (Page 15) and try to correct the problem.

To disconnect the telephone, squeeze the clip on the modular plug and pull it out of the jack.








Handset

(1)	Visual ringer indicator	Flashes when there is an incoming call.
(2)	Switch hook	 Lift the handset from the telephone base to make a call. Place the handset to the telephone base to end a call.
(3)	MEM	When the telephone is not in use, press this key and followed by a dialing key (0-9) to dial the stored speed dial number.
(4)	REDIAL	Press to call the last dialed number.
(5)	Dialing key pad	
	TONE 💥	 Press to switch to tone dialing temporarily during a call if you have pulse service.

6	TONE/PULSE	+	Switch to left for tone dialing (TT); or switch to right for pulse dialing (DP).
7	PROG/MUTE)	When the telephone is not in use, press this key followed by a dialing key (0-9) to store the speed dial number. While on a call, press to mute the microphone. The other party cannot hear you, but you can hear the other party. Press again to return to two-way conversation.
8	Receiver (handset) volume switch	•	Switch between NORMAL and LOUD listening volume.
9	FLASH	•	Press to activate custom calling services such as call waiting or 3-way calling. NOTE : You may have to press other buttons before or after pressing FLASH , as explained in custom calling instructions provided by your local telephone company.
(10)	Ringer volume switch	*	Switch to middle to set the telephone to ring at low volume (LO). Switch to right to set the telephone to ring at high volume (HI). Switch to left to turn off the telephone ringer (OFF). You can dial or answer calls normally when the ringer is off. Other telephones in your home will still ring; they are not affected by the switch.



Telephone base overview



Telephone base

- Reversible handset A Reverse the handset tab for wall-mounting. This tab holds the handset in place when you hang up.
 - Directory card You can write the telephone numbers (or names) that you want to store in each memory location.

Operate

Redial

This telephone stores the last phone number dialed in redial memory. However, if the phone is disconnected from the wall jack or if you are without phone service for more than 30 minutes, redial memory will be lost.

The redial memory can accept numbers up to 31 digits long. The number will remain in redial memory until you change it by dialing another telephone number.

To dial the same number again, lift the handset, and press **REDIAL**.

Erasing redial memory

For privacy, you can erase the redial memory. Lift the handset, then press 1 and hang up.



Note: If the number is more than 31 digits long, no digits will be stored in the redial memory.

Call waiting / three-way calling

- Press **FLASH** instead of pressing the switch hook to activate custom calling services such as call waiting or 3-way calling.
- You may have to press other buttons before or after pressing **FLASH**, as explained in custom calling instructions provided by your local telephone company.

Mute

- While on a call, press **PROG/MUTE** to mute the microphone. The other party cannot hear you, but you can hear the other party.
- Press **PROG/MUTE** again to return to two-way conversation.

Operate

Ringer volume

The ringer volume switch allows you to turn the telephone ringer **OFF**, or set it to ring at **LO** or **HI** volume. You can dial or answer calls normally when the ringer is off. Other telephones in your home will still ring; they are not affected by the switch.



Ringer tone

You can choose from three different ringer tones. The phone comes set to Tone 2.

- 1. Press PROG/MUTE.
- 2. Press #.
- 3. Press 3 for Tone 1.

Press 6 for Tone 2.

- OR -

Press 9 for Tone 3.




Press **0** to temporarily turn off the ringer.

Lifting the handset and replacing it onto the base will turn the ringer back on.

Receiver (handset) volume

The receiver volume switch on the side of the handset can be adjusted for a comfortable listening level. The switch has three volume positions.





Temporary tone dialing

Temporary tone dialing is used only when you have rotary service. It allows you to access to services that require tone signaling, including some tone-activated computer systems (e.g., telephone banking).

To change from pulse (rotary) to tone dialing during a call:

- 1. Dial a telephone number with the dial switch set to **DP** (pulse).
- 2. Press **TONE** **, all buttons pressed after this will send tone signals.
- 3. After you hang up, the phone automatically returns to rotary service.




Memory features

This telephone can store up to 10 different phone numbers, each up to 21 digits long. Numbers will remain stored in memory unless you erase or change them by entering other numbers.



Note: Numbers programmed into a memory location might not be retained if the telephone has been unplugged from the line jack for a half hour or more.

Directory card: Remove the directory card. Write your telephone number in the space provided. Also write the telephone numbers (or names) that you want to store in each memory location. Reinstall the card and clear plastic cover.



Memory dialing

Speed dialing

Ten telephone numbers can be stored in standard speed-dialing locations. You can dial any of these numbers by pressing two buttons.

To program numbers into memory:

- 1. Lift the handset.
- Press PROG/MUTE.
- Press MEM.
- 4. Enter a digit (0-9) for the memory location where you want to store the number.
- 5. Enter the telephone number. You will hear a click when each button is pressed.
- Press PROG/MUTE.
- 7. Hang up after the number is entered correctly.
- 8. Repeat Steps 1-7 to store another number.

To dial:

- Lift the handset and listen for dial tone.
- Press MEM.
- 3. Press memory location (0-9).

To erase numbers from memory:

To erase any number from memory, you can enter another number in the same location.

No dial tone

- Make sure all plugs are connected properly. Inspect the line cord connections at the modular wall jack and at the telephone. Also inspect the coiled handset cord connections at both ends.
- Unplug the telephone and connect it to another modular wall jack. If it still does
 not work, try another telephone; if neither telephone works, the problem is not
 in your telephone. The trouble may be caused by local telephone company lines,
 central office equipment, or the wiring in your home.

Calls cannot be dialed, or are dialed slowly

This product comes set in the tone (TT) mode. Make sure you choose the correct dialing method (TT or DP) for the dial switch. Touch tone dialing will not work if you have dial pulse service. If you have tone dialing service, you can use either tone or dial pulse mode. If you set the switch to TT, numbers are dialed much more quickly.

You can hear the other party, but other party can't hear you

- The Mute feature might be activated.
- Try pressing PROG/MUTE.
- If this doesn't work, try pressing PROG/MUTE again.
- If you program a number into memory while on a call, the other party will be unable to hear you.

Telephone does not ring

- Make sure the ringer volume switch is not set to OFF.
- You may have inadvertently turned off the ringer. Press PROG/MUTE, #, 6, PROG/MUTE.
- If there are several other phones on the same line, try disconnecting some of the other telephones. Having too many telephones can also create problems such as low ringer volume or impaired quality during calls.

1. Product identifier and REN information

The label on the back or bottom of this equipment contains, among other things, an identifier indicating product approval and the Ringer Equivalence Number (REN). This information must be provided to your telephone service provider upon request. For equipment approved prior to July 23, 2001, the product identifier is preceded by the phrase "FCC Reg No." and the REN is listed separately. For equipment approved after that date, the product identifier is preceded by "US" and a colon (:), and the REN is encoded in the product identifier without a decimal point as the sixth and seventh characters following the colon. For example, the product identifier US:AAAEQ03T123XYZ would indicate an REN of 0.3.

The REN is used to determine how many devices you may connect to your telephone line and still have them ring when you are called. In most, but not all areas, the sum of all RENS should be five (5.0) or less. You may want to contact your telephone service provider for more information.

2. Connection and use with the nationwide telephone network.

The plug and jack used to connect this equipment to the premises wiring and the telephone network must comply with the applicable part 68 rules and technical requirements adopted by ACTA. A compliant telephone cord and modular plug are provided with this product. It is designed to be connected to a compatible modular jack that is also compliant. An RJ11 jack should normally be used for connecting to a single line and an RJ14 jack for two lines, see installation instructions in the user's manual. This equipment may not be used with coin telephone lines or with party lines. If you have specially wired alarm dialing equipment connected to our telephone line, ensure the connection of this equipment does not disable your alarm equipment. If you have questions about what will disable the alarm equipment, consult your telephone service provider or qualified installer.

3. Repair instructions

If this equipment is malfunctioning, it must be unplugged from the modular jack until the problem has been corrected. Replacement to this telephone equipment can only be made by the manufacturer or its authorized agents. For replacement procedures, follow the instructions outlined under the limited warranty.

FCC, ACTA and IC information

4. Rights of the telephone service provider

If this equipment is causing harm to the telephone network, the telephone service provider may temporarily discontinue your telephone service. The telephone service provider is required to notify you before interrupting service.

If advance notice is not practical, you will be notified as soon as possible. You will be given the opportunity to correct the problem and the telephone service provider is required to inform you of your right to file a complaint with the FCC. Your telephone service provider may make changes in its facilities, equipment, operation, or procedures that could affect the proper functioning of this product. The telephone service provider is required to notify you if such changes are planned.

5. Hearing aid compatibility

If this product is equipped with a corded or cordless handset, it is hearing aid compatible.

6. Programming/testing of emergency numbers

If this product has memory dialing locations, you may choose to store police, fire department and emergency medical service telephone numbers in these locations. If you do, please keep three things in mind:

- a. We recommend that you also write the telephone number on the directory card (if applicable), so that you can still dial the emergency number manually if the memory dialing feature doesn't work.
- b. This feature is provided only as a convenience, and the manufacturer assumes no responsibility for customer reliance upon the memory feature.
- c. Testing the emergency telephone numbers you have stored is not recommended. However, if you do make a call to an emergency number:
 - You must remain on the line and briefly explain the reason for the call before hanging up.
 - Programming/testing of emergency numbers should be performed during off-peak hours, such as in the early morning or late evening, when the emergency services tend to be less busy.

2. What will Advanced American Telephones do if the Product is not free from material defects in materials and workmanship during the limited warranty period ("Materially Defective Product")?

During the limited warranty period, Advanced American Telephones' authorized service representative will replace, at Advanced American Telephones' option, without charge, a Materially Defective Product. If we choose to replace this Product, we may replace it with a new or refurbished Product of the same or similar design. Advanced American Telephones will return replacement Products to you in working condition.

Advanced American Telephones will retain defective parts, modules, or equipment. Replacement of Product, at Advanced American Telephones' option, is your exclusive remedy. You should expect the replacement to take approximately 30 days.

3. How long is the limited warranty period?

4. What is not covered by this limited warranty?
